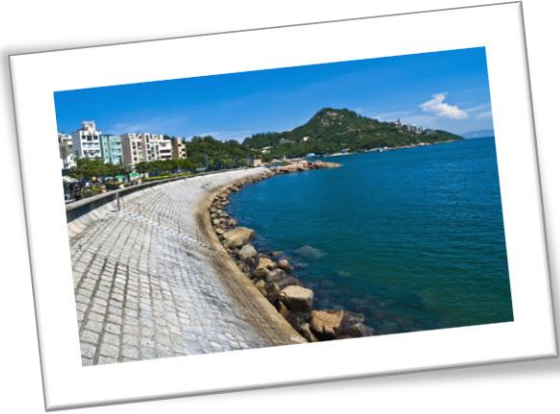
Brief Introduction to the Tourist Spots

Repulse Bay (Free)

Repulse Bay is located on the southern part of Hong Kong Island. The bay is crescent shaped, surrounded by hills and the sea, and has a clean, shallow beach. One of the most popular beaches in Hong Kong, Repulse Bay is a great summertime destination for locals and visitors to Hong Kong. There are also plenty interesting sites nearby.



Stanley Peninsula (Free)



Stanley Peninsula is located at the southern end of Hong Kong Island, between Repulse Bay and Shek O. The small town of Stanley, centered on Stanley Street, has harbour beaches with gentle sea breeze, ancient temples with a long history, and free and lively markets. And Bar Street, where Chinese and Western cultures blend harmoniously, forming a beautiful and beautiful seaside town.

Cape D'Aguilar (Free)

There are rocky shores hit by wind and waves in the coastal reserve, which is a common landform on promontories and headlands in the southeast of Hong Kong. The steeply sloping granite banks are rugged and irregular stone steps, with vertical planes up to one meter high, and small rock sheds, which will form temporary small pools if the sea surges. The biodiversity in the Hok Tsui Marine Reserve is quite rich, including a variety of fish, stony corals, soft corals, gorgonians and marine invertebrates. Hok Tsui Coastal Reserve is known as the "eye of God" as a holy place for Internet celebrities to take pictures.



Shek O (Free)

Shek O is a beach-side village located on the south-eastern part of Hong Kong Island. The name Shek O literally means "rocky bay" and the entire area is a peninsula facing the South China Sea. Shek O Beach is probably one of the most popular, and scenic beaches on Hong Kong Island. It is often the first beach that anyone new to Hong Kong visits. From here you can glimpse the other side of Hong Kong, the side without skyscrapers.
